Science Month



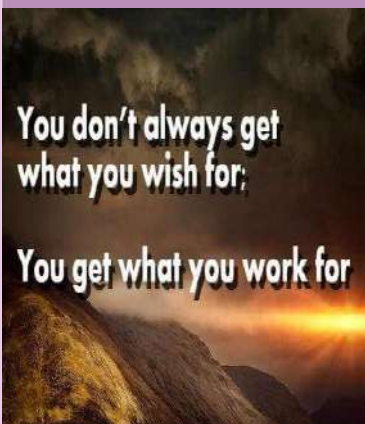

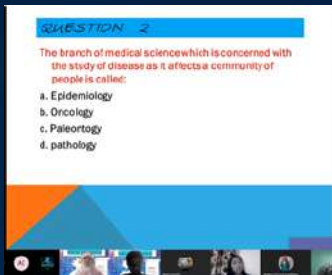
DEBATE: The debates were held on February 4th and 7th for the 9th and 11th grades. The debates had the title “Debate Ambiental”. The second debate had the topic of “*COVID-19 measures have mixed impacts on the environment*” and was also very professionally carried out by the participants.

As the name implies, the objective was to create an outfit with the help of recycled waste materials. This activity also created an awareness in the students about protecting the environment by making use of waste materials. SCIENCE TALK: The Science Talk was done by the grades of 11 and 12 on various topics in the field of science, ranging from Biotechnology to Artificial Intelligence. The students creatively presented their topics by speaking confidently.

CARTOON COMPETITION: The Cartoon competition had the students to get artistic by making a hand drawn or virtual cartoon/comic on the topics of "Innovating for the Future", "Biohazards" and "Fight against Coronavirus".

The students of grade 7 and 8 had presented innovative artworks and animations on these topics.

PHOTOGRAPHY: The next competition was Photography for grades 7 and 8. The theme was "Nature at its best" and required the students to capture a photo of Mother Nature in through their eyes. The objective was to allow students to appreciate and love nature through photography.

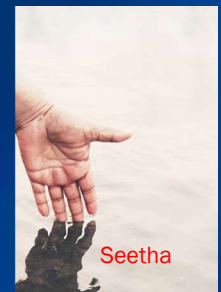

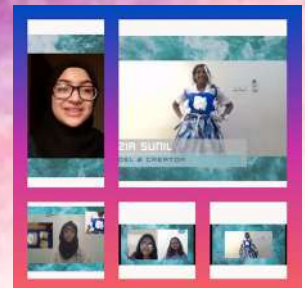
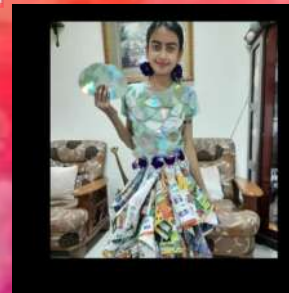

5 TOP TIPS FOR EFFECTIVE EXAM REVISION

AS RECOMMENDED BY PREVIOUS UNIVERSITY STUDENTS!*

- 1. START EARLY**
Don't leave it to last minute! Start revising a couple of weeks before your exams to give your brain time to absorb.
- 2. PLAN YOUR TIME**
