
ENGLISH MONTH


What is lead?

LEAD POISONING OCCURS WHEN LEAD BUILDS UP IN THE BODY, OFTEN OVER MONTHS OR YEARS. EVEN SMALL AMOUNTS OF LEAD CAN CAUSE SERIOUS HEALTH PROBLEMS. CHILDREN YOUNGER THAN 6 YEARS ARE ESPECIALLY VULNERABLE TO LEAD POISONING, WHICH CAN SEVERELY AFFECT MENTAL AND PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT.

Chelation therapy is a chemical process in which a synthetic solution -EDTA is injected into the bloodstream to remove heavy metals and/or minerals from the body

Lead poisoning, also known as plumbism and saturnism, is a type of metal poisoning caused by lead in the body. The brain is the most sensitive. Symptoms may include abdominal pain, constipation, headaches, irritability, memory problems, infertility, and tingling in the hands and feet.

Symptoms

Initially, lead poisoning can be hard to detect — even people who seem healthy can have high blood levels of lead. Signs and symptoms usually don't appear until dangerous amounts have accumulated.
