
Week of Welcome "The New Normal"





to know the new environment and people.






Plants exhibit diversity and variation.

Skip counting is often called counting by 2s or by 5s or by 10s. Skip counting really helps with addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. It is also used a lot for counting things - counting pairs of gloves, groups of five, money, boxes with 100 cans in each box - the list goes on!



















Distance Learning


Arabic Reading Competition



Grade 6_ Newsletter September, 2020





Grade 6 rejoined the school in the mode of Distance as per the ADEK Guidelines.




Walking through the shots of Virtual assembly










Corner for the Science
