*this area have have changed from ancient times but in 1971 they finally adopted a flag for themselves.*



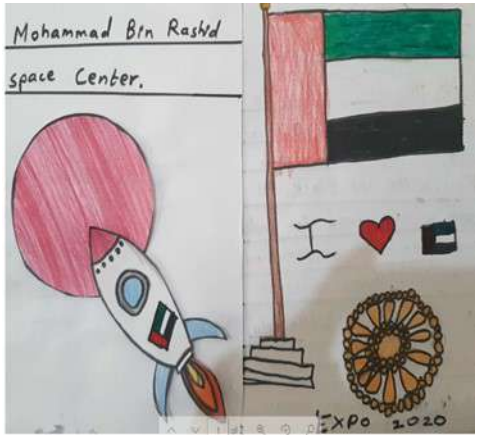
## *Patriotic Pin wheel*

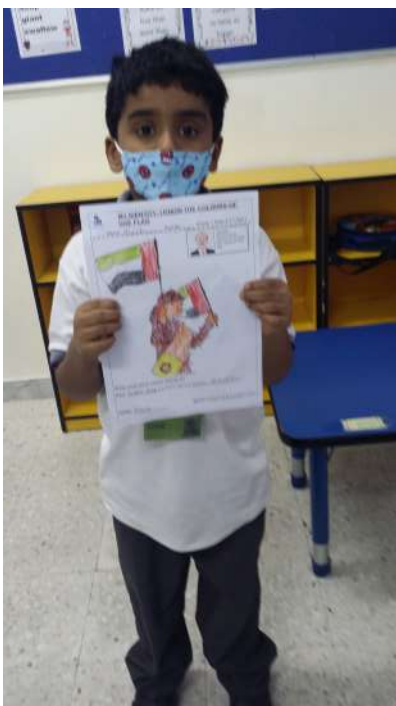
### INDIAN CULTURE AND HERITAGE ACTIVITY

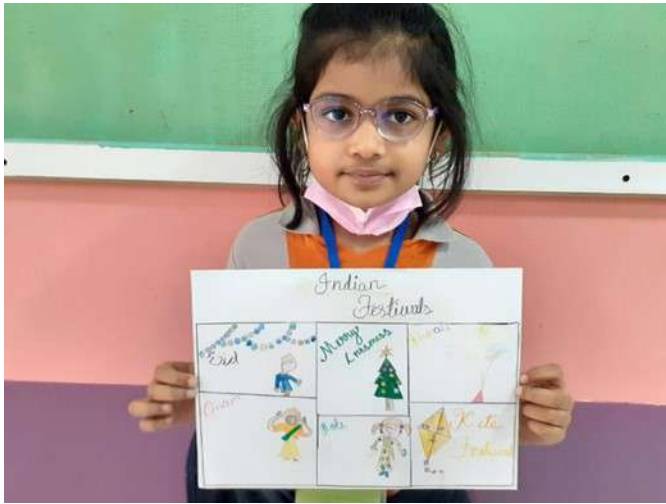








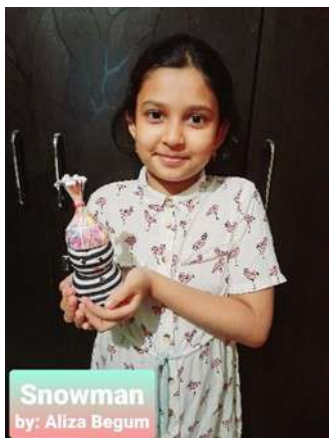
