
VISUAL LITERACY CORNERS






As global communication expands throughout the world so does the need for a global language. English Language serves this purpose. It plays a great part in our daily life developing the essential skills.





















































WORD PYRAMID




INNOVATION

Hi everyone, I'm Roshan and I study in class 6 in Al ain juniors school, located in the UAE. Today, I'm going to show you my latest robot called the COVID warning robot, a robot that warns people not to enter a quarantine zone. The main parts of this robot are:

- Brick: It is the central computer and CPU of the robot that stores and runs programs, stores
 and shows sensor values and can be Bluetooth connected.
- Ultrasonic sensor: As the name states, it can sense an object at a certain distance by putting
 out sound waves at a range to try to identify the distance between the robot and the object.

The robot is made from the parts of the LEGO Mindstorms EV3 core kit.



At first, the robot tells the person to stand on the feet symbol on a foot mat

Where the robot identifies that the person is standing on the designated zone.
