The students of different nationalities made a popular art form which is popular in their respective countries.




MS. NITHYA








EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

More than 6.4 million people were in dire need of humanitarian aid in Pakistan after the catastrophic floods affected more than 33 million and killed at least 1,314 people including 458 children since mid-June.

The School community of Al Ain Juniors has initiated an emergency appeal for donations to support the flood victims. The initiative was led by Al Ain Juniors School in coordination with Emirates Red Crescent Authority.


Besides raising funds to build a house for the flood victims, the school community has collected blankets, mosquito nets; dry rations such as lentils, pulses, rice; new clothing, shoes, socks; and hygiene essentials such as soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, and towels.

The contribution was shipped to Pakistan through Emirates Red Crescent Authority and the donated essentials were carefully supplied to the flood-affected areas in Pakistan.
