



AS AN INTERSCHOOL EVENT, THIS CONFERENCE PROVIDED A PLATFORM FOR STUDENTS FROM VARIOUS SCHOOLS TO STEP INTO THE ROLES OF DIPLOMATS, ENGAGING IN THOUGHT-PROVOKING DISCUSSIONS ON PRESSING GLOBAL ISSUES.

THE DAY COMMENCED EARLY, WITH EAGER DELEGATES, READY TO IMMERSE THEMSELVES IN A DAY FILLED WITH DIPLOMACY, DEBATE, AND COLLABORATION. THIS EXPERIENCE ALLOWED DELEGATES TO REFINE THEIR PUBLIC SPEAKING, CRITICAL THINKING, AND DIPLOMACY SKILLS WHILE COLLABORATIVELY ADDRESSING COMPLEX GLOBAL CHALLENGES. ADDITIONALLY, PARTICIPANTS HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO HONE THEIR REPORTING, WRITING, AND PHOTOGRAPHY SKILLS UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF CHIEF OF MEDIA CHELSEA ROBERT AND HER WELL-TRAINED TEAM. TO FURTHER ENGAGE ATTENDEES, INTERACTIVE QUIZ GAMES WERE ORGANIZED BY TAMJEED SHARIF DURING BREAKS, ADDING AN ELEMENT OF FUN TO THE INTELLECTUAL RIGOR.




SCHOOL TRIPS




STEAM Competition ABU DHABI UNIVERSITY, ALAIN


The Worthless Pride: Toru Oikawa

90s punk aesthetic; fun, most hated characters, and mostly importantly its great music. At first, I didn't think that I would like the anime because the animation style of it wasn't really the best. But before I knew it I got hooked because Nana quickly became very dark and complex. It's an anime about music but it doesn't capture the love and happiness that music can bring. Rather the entire amount of emotions that come along with pursuing a lifestyle in it. It gives you an authentic picture of not just the characters but what feels like actual people trying to reconcile their trauma by pursuing their dreams. However, it takes the concept of their dreams that we often see tackled in this anime and twist them in their head to reveal how difficult it can be.

It's about two female leads that come from entirely different walks of life. They happen to end up sitting next to each other on the train heading to Tokyo and they both share the same name "Nana", the same age and the same disappointment with their love lives. From there, it branches out to other characters who also have troubled past and are trapped by an image of the life they think they want of the way society has treated them that they should be. For instance, Nana has abandonment issues caused by her mother's negative connotations for her which is why she fights against her mother's tradition, striving to be strong and independent. She aims to be a rockstar with her band known as "BLAST" and for Hachi, (a girl with pink hair also named as Nana) she blindly follows her dream of being a housewife and be in a picture-perfect family. Her idea of love, happiness and dreams are idealized, romanticized shown by their music in the anime.

This anime shows us a closer look into these characters' lives and how fame can just serve as a cage where your dreams just vanish. The characters are written so complex. However, Nana is not just about the music. At its core, it's about relationships- not only the romantic ones, but also between friends. Many of these characters are so afraid of being alone due to their past trauma but it's encapsulated by the writers so well that it's shown how they cope in different ways. This helps us show what it means to give too much or too little of yourself in a relationship and the effects it can have to people around them. 
