- Payment invoice, Bonafide certificate or any other certificate for AY 2025-2026 shall be issued **from 7th September 2026 onwards after the confirmation of re-enrollment** by paying the first



installment which includes Re-registration Fee, Tuition fee for August / September 2026, MOE books fee, transport fee (if availing).

- Transfer Certificate (T.C.) for student moving outside Abu Dhabi Emirate, can only be issued **from 20th August 2026**
- IGCSE, AS, and A-Level Certificates will be issued as soon as the school receives the same from the CIE.



Fee Settlement & Payment Instructions

A. Fee Settlement

To confirm your child's enrollment for the Academic Year 2026–2027, please note the following requirements:

1. All outstanding fees for Academic Year 2025–2026 must be fully settled.
2. The first installment for Academic Year 2026–2027, which includes:
 - Tuition fee for September 2026
 - Transportation fee (if applicable)
 - Ministry of Education (MOE) booksmust be paid no later than two weeks before the start of the new academic year.

Please be advised that students whose enrollment confirmation process has not been completed within the prescribed timeline will not have access to tuition and transportation services from the first day of school.
